On Saturday, April 10 at 2 PM, join us for a virtual author visit! Dorothy Montgomery, a former Viola resident visits us via Zoom to discuss her historical fiction novel Stone Fruit. This novel focuses on a New York based writer for European Art magazine, Patricia Powell. She realizes you can go home again when she returns to her native Iowa to write a story about the death of Nan Wood Graham—the famous face of American Gothic. In researching the story, she learns about her own connections to Nan Wood Graham, and the historic Stone City Art Colony. She makes a discovery that will change how the art world perceives American Gothic, and in doing so, changes how she perceives herself and her past. 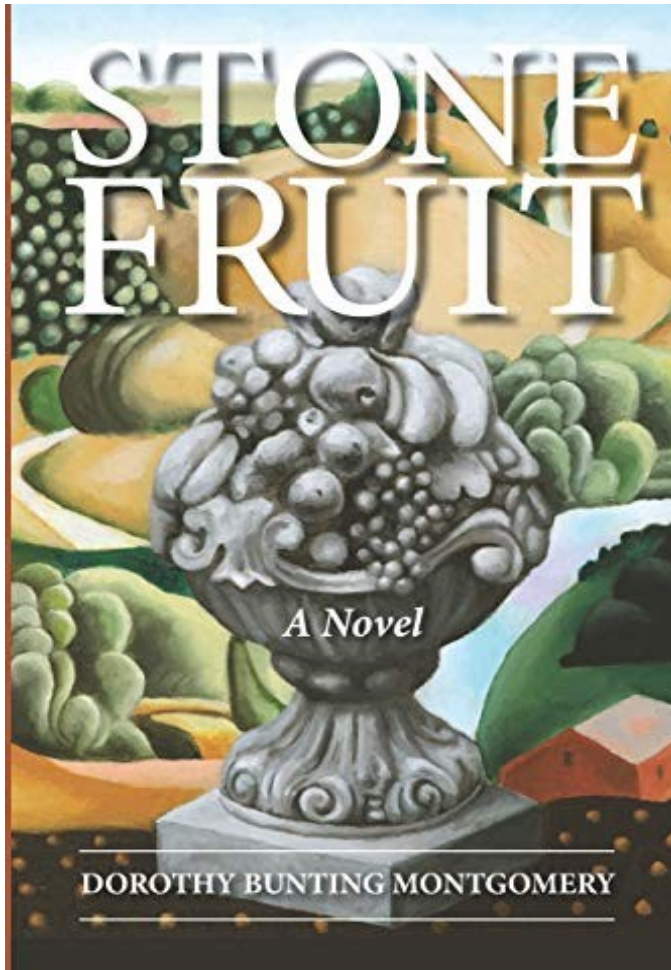
### The Gazette
