The Book Woman of Troublesome Creek

This book brought to life a part of America's story I knew nothing about. President Franklin Roosevelt started the Pack Horse Library Project in 1930's Kentucky. The purpose of the project was to get books to the poverty-stricken families living in the Appalachians.

The main character of this book is Cussy Mary Carter. In addition to being a book woman in the Project, she is one of the "Kentucky Blues"—the blue skinned people of the area. The blue skin tone was the result of a genetic anomaly of people in the Troublesome Creek area, and the cause of discrimination in many cases.

The author's attention to the language of the residents plus her exhaustive research truly make the characters and their world realistic. This novel includes photos of the actual librarians and tells such an engrossing story that it is truly "unputdownable".
