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#### **BRING DOLLY TO SPRINGVILLE**

Imagine every child ages 0-5 in Springville could get a book sent to them every month until they reach the age of five. Well, we can do that with a little help from you. The Dolly Parton Imagination Library makes this possible. Through their foundation, for \$26 a year per child, a registered child will be mailed a book a month addressed to that child. Can you imagine the excitement of that child as the book comes to them? We can.

Dolly Parton started the Imagination Library in honor of her father who couldn't read. Dolly wants to put books in the hands of as many children as possible. Since its beginning in 1995, over 204 million books have been mailed to children worldwide. In order to bring the Imagination Library to the 52336 zip code, we need to raise \$5,000 to get this program off the ground. This will cover the cost of the books and mailing for two years. We want to keep it going longer than two years, so this will need your support in the future also. Books typically cost \$13 each but due to the buying power of the Dollywood Foundation, the average book costs just \$2.20.

An example of what your sponsorship/donation can do: \$26 sponsors one child for one year; \$130 will give a child a book a month for five years; and \$500 will give 19 children a book a month for a year. There is no greater joy than seeing a child read a book. From reading books comes knowledge, and knowledge makes a thinking, caring adult.

All donations are tax deductible through the Springville Community Schools Foundation 501c3 status.
