BOOK REVIEW

<u>Stars Over Clear Lake</u> by Loretta Ellsworth is a novel set in the Mason City-Clear Lake area where the author grew up. In the 1940's there was a German POW camp in nearby Algona, IA. The German inmates worked for local farmers who needed help with farm work.

The book's main character is a young woman named Lorraine. Her father uses some of the POWs, though his wife is violently opposed to having Nazis on their property. Lorraine becomes acquainted with the young POWs. She falls in love with one of them named Jens. Her parents do not approve, especially since she's already engaged to an acceptable young American man. Both of these romantic situations cause her anguish as she tries to decide between the two.

The plot's timeline shifts between the 1940's, when the POWs are there, 1947 when the famous Surf Ballroom burns down and 2007 when Lorraine returns to the rebuilt Ballroom. She must deal with her memories of the original ballroom fire, the cause of which has never been determined. The tale comes to an emotional conclusion as Lorraine remembers it all.

Enjoy this book—it's a wonderful read!
