The Director Recommends

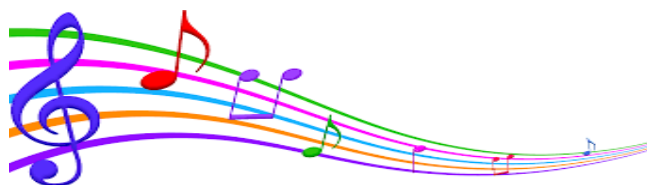
The Women by Kristin Hannah
